## City Breaks Ground on 911 Call Center

Hutchinson Metro Center is getting a new neighbor - the City of New York. The City recently broke ground for a new 911 Call Center to be built on a site adjacent to the Hutch.

The new 550,000-square-foot building is part of a major overhaul of the city communications network. It will house the call-taking and dispatch operations among police, fire, and emergency medical responders.

As part of this major construction project, the main road leading into the Hutch will become a public road and be renamed Marconi Place.

Marconi Place will be serviced by MTA bus service, which will be a major benefit and convenience for the tenants at the Hutch.

In addition, the current Hutch Metro Shuttle will continue to provide free service to and from the complex.
